Description

The Senior Manager builds, leads, and manages a team of skilled professionals to case manage assessments and approvals for significant state projects under the state's Lead Agency Framework. The role provides timely updates and advice on key issues to ensure the transparency and visibility of the project status.

This role also leads and supports the Department to effectively contribute to the development and improvement of assessment processes and to streamline existing approval pathways.

Responsibilities

In context of above description, the role:

- Leads a team providing high level, professional scientific and technical oversight specifically related to state significant industrial developments.
- Delivers a case management service to proponents which aligns departmental approvals by providing a single point of contact for proponents and government stakeholders.
- Identifies issues that might delay assessment and facilitates early engagement across government agencies.
- Engages with lead agencies, including the Department of Energy and Economic Development (DEED) and the Office of the Co-ordinator General in developing Cross Sector triage functionality within Government.
- Manages workload and prioritises meeting deadlines in line with departmental guidelines and developing a successful and productive branch that is innovative, collaborative and delivers sector and divisional outcomes.
- Liaises with the relevant departmental staff to apply expertise and knowledge of legislation, policy, and regulation in the context of the department's regulatory functions in relation to environmental assessments and compliance.
- Provides high quality policy, specialist and technical advice within the Priority Approvals directorate on issues relating to environmental impact assessment.
- Consults, collaborates, influences, negotiates and manages conflict with a diverse range of stakeholders to gain mutual commitment and achieve sustainable outcomes.
- Reviews processes and practices to foster an environment that mitigates risks, is integrity driven and encourages innovation and continuous improvement.
- Maintains data and reports on the timeliness of all assessments for their agency (significant projects) including recording proponent feedback and learnings.
- Maintains an awareness and understanding of emerging issues and trends related to the significant industrial developments at both the state and national level.
- Contributes to multi-agency working groups and represents the department on state and national committees as required.
- Undertakes additional duties as required within the skills and scope of the position capabilities and departmental needs.
