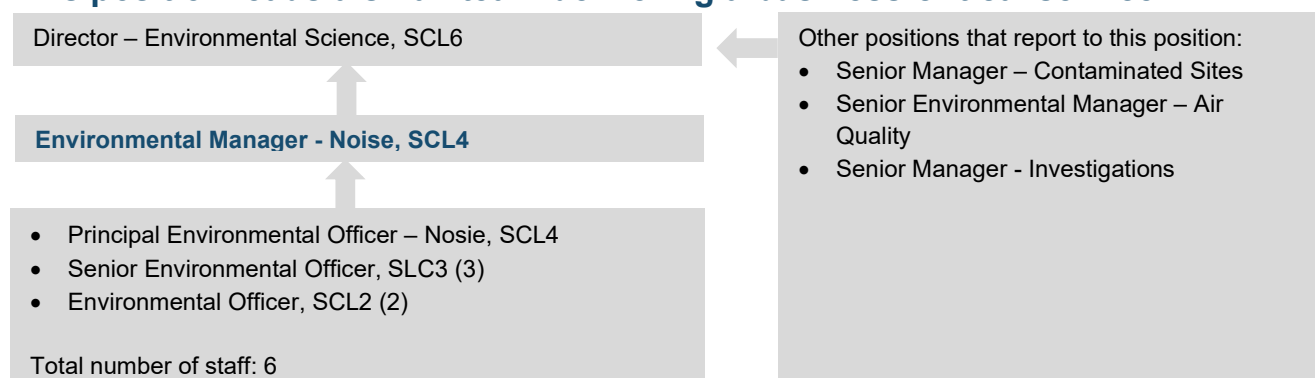
Description

The Environmental Manager – Noise, leads the provision of environmental noise technical expertise and best practice regulatory guidance to stakeholders. The role provides technical input into major change initiatives, system-wide reforms and leads the team to implement contemporary best practice science, integrated with other statutory processes across jurisdictions.

Responsibilities

- Administration of the Environmental Protection (Noise) Regulations 1997 and the noise provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1986 including resolution of contentious issues and operational procedures.
- Assessment of reports on noise issues including noise regulation exemptions and approvals.
- Provide authoritative and reliable expert science-based and technical environmental noise advice to the EPA and Minister on complex assessment issues, options and solutions.
- The provision of support and technical advice to local government and other agencies which administer noise legislation.
- The provision of technical advice to internal and external stakeholders.
- Staff, and the development, maintenance and sharing of expertise to improve knowledge and build capability throughout the Department.
- Upholds equity, diversity and inclusion, work health and safety and ethical principles in all aspects of this role.
- Promotes and ensures a safe workplace, addressing both physical and psychosocial safety.
- Applies curiosity and performs other duties as required
- Demonstrates leadership behaviours and upholds our values in all actions.
